

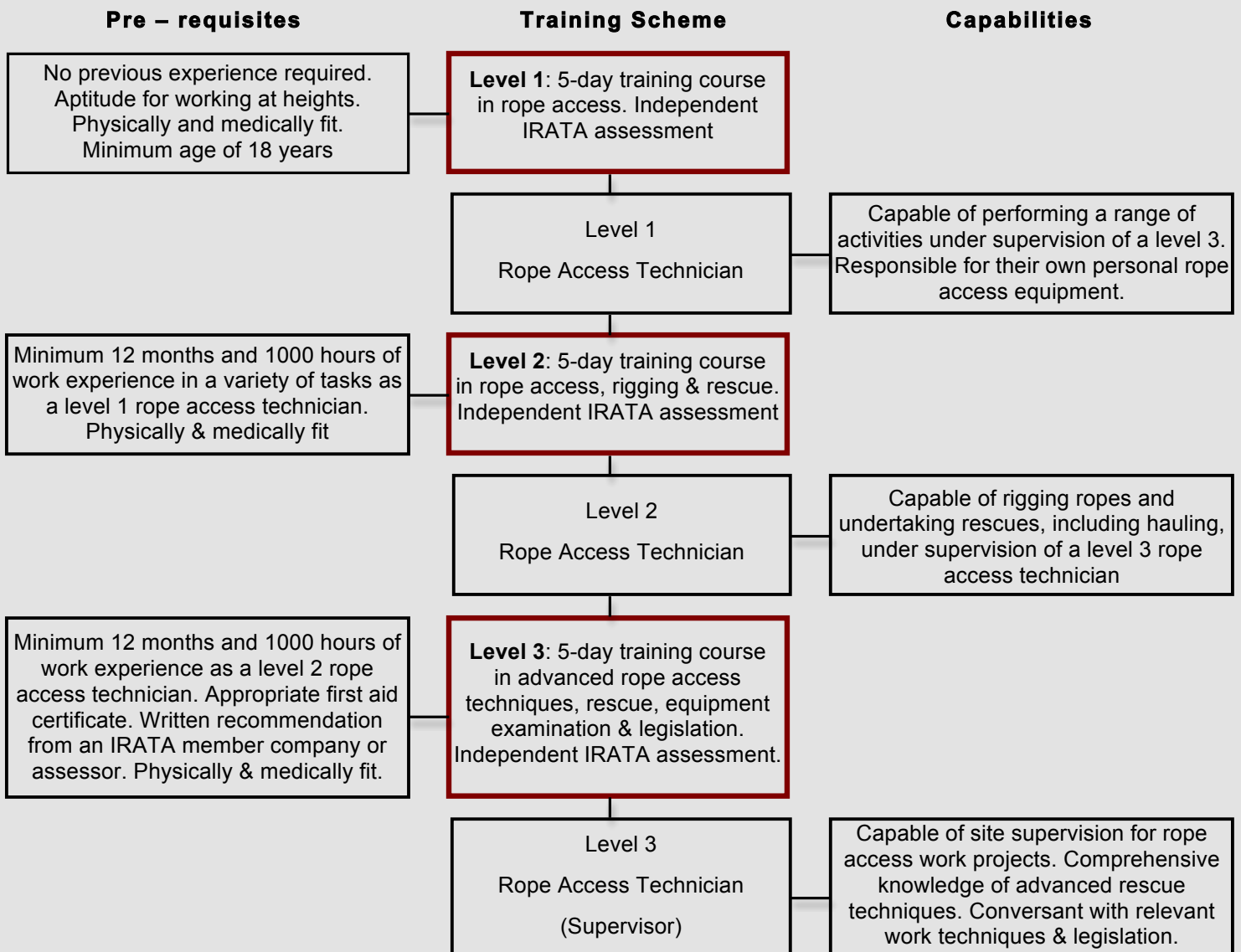

In addition to Level 1, 2 and 3 courses Vertech also offers;

Re-assessments

IRATA requires re-assessment every three years at all levels, following a minimum of two days of refresher training. Any level 2 or 3 rope access technician undertaking re-assessment after the expiry of the current assessment would require four days of training instead of the two days. Any level 2 or level 3 rope access technician undertaking re-assessment in excess of six months after the expiry of the current assessment will revert to a lower level. To ensure technicians are up to date with certification, re-assessment may be done up to 6 months before due expiry date without any time penalty.

Refresher training

Rope access technicians not engaged in rope access work for six months or more, are required to attend refresher training

On the Day

Training courses are held at: U4, 21 Harris Road, Malaga, Western Australia 6090. They run from Monday to Friday, 8:30am to 4:30 pm; training will be Monday to Thursday and the assessment will be on Friday.

What to bring:

- ✓ We recommend wearing comfortable loose-fitting clothing (thick clothing can be uncomfortable while wearing a harness). Shorts should be at least above knee length to accommodate harness leg loops.
- ✓ Enclosed footwear is required and should be comfortable i.e. trainer type/hiking shoes recommended (steel cap boots are not essential).
- ✓ Although the course is 90% practical it is recommended to bring a notepad and pens for the theoretical material.
- ✓ Lunch – there is a microwave and a variety of food and beverages available at the centre. There is also a lunch bar nearby.

Vertech will supply all training manuals and rope access equipment.
